Scripture for the Sermon:

Romans 12:3-8 NIV

³ For by the grace given me I say to every one of you: Do not think of yourself more highly than you ought, but rather think of yourself with sober judgment, in accordance with the faith God has distributed to each of you. ⁴ For just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, ⁵ so in Christ we, though many, form one body, and each

member belongs to all the others. ⁶ We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us. If your gift is prophesying, then prophesy in accordance with your^[a] faith; ⁷ if it is serving, then serve; if it is teaching, then teach; ⁸ if it is to encourage, then give encouragement; if it is giving, then give generously; if it is to lead,^[b] do it diligently; if it is to show mercy, do it cheerfully.

Romans 12:3-8 The Message

³ I'm speaking to you out of deep gratitude for all that God has given me, and especially as I have responsibilities in relation to you. Living then, as every one of you does, in pure grace, it's important that you not misinterpret yourselves as people who are bringing this goodness to God. No, God brings it all to you. The only accurate way to understand ourselves is by what God is and by what he does for us, not by what we are and what we do for him.

⁴⁻⁶ In this way we are like the various parts of a human body. Each part gets its meaning from the body as a whole, not the other way around. The body we're talking about is Christ's body of chosen people. Each of us finds our meaning and function as a part of his body. But as a chopped-off finger or cut-off toe we wouldn't amount to much, would we? So since we find ourselves fashioned into all these excellently formed and marvelously functioning parts in Christ's body, let's just go ahead and be what we were made to be, without enviously or pridefully comparing ourselves with each other, or trying to be something we aren't.

⁶⁻⁸ If you preach, just preach God's Message, nothing else; if you help, just help, don't take over; if you teach, stick to your teaching; if you give encouraging guidance, be careful that you don't get bossy; if you're put in charge, don't manipulate; if you're called to give aid to people in distress, keep your eyes open and be quick to respond; if you work with the disadvantaged, don't let yourself get irritated with them or depressed by them. Keep a smile on your face.

Instructions Related to In-Person Worship:

In John 13:34-35 Jesus says: "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."

In this short and familiar passage, Jesus calls us to love others, the way he has loved us. Love shows up many different ways. Perhaps the best way is putting others before ourselves. It is with this in mind, we have established the following safety protocols:

- Masks are to be worn for the entirety of the time gathered with the church
- Attendance has been limited for each service
- Registration is necessary before and once you've arrived, to help with contact tracing (in case that becomes needed at any point)
- Practicing social distancing (sitting six feet apart, asking families to remain together)
- Hand sanitizers are available, and we will be cleaning in between services
- No physical contact with others (sorry, no handshaking or hugging)
- Lastly, we hope you haven't chosen to worship in-person if you know that you have been exposed to Covid-19 or if you have any symptoms of illness.

These protocols help slow down and even stop the spread of the virus. In a public setting like this, these protocols are a way for us to protect one another. For all of us, this is a sacrifice. But sacrificial love looks like Christ, and it blesses other. Thank you for joining us in loving one another this way.

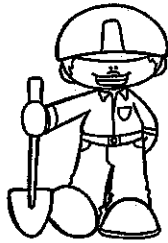

Today we learned about Spiritual Gifts. Attached is an inventory your child took to learn more about his/her gifts. Take time to discuss, with your child, how they can use their Spiritual Gifts to serve God and others.



Spiritual Gifts

TEACH: show God's love by teaching others

Your child tends to enjoy...

→ learning, reading, asking questions, being organized, studying God's word and facts

SERVE: show God's love by meeting people's needs

Your child tends to enjoy...

→ working, short-term tasks, being dependable, organized, appreciated and saying "yes" to tasks

GIVE: show God's love by giving to others

Your child tends to enjoy...

→ saving things, sharing things, giving in secret, working hard and meeting needs

ENCOURAGE: show God's love by encouraging spiritual growth

Your child tends to enjoy...

→ comforting others, memorizing scripture, being thankful, reading the Bible, and helping others grow in their faith.
